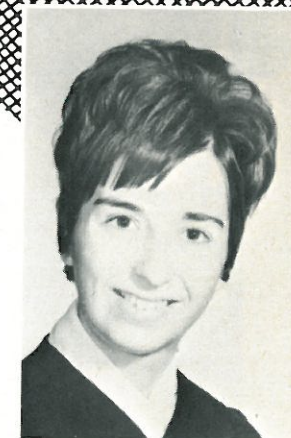
Our instructors have shown us new paths, tried to help us to know ourselves better, and have tried to awaken us. Now we must not fail them. We must think and grow.

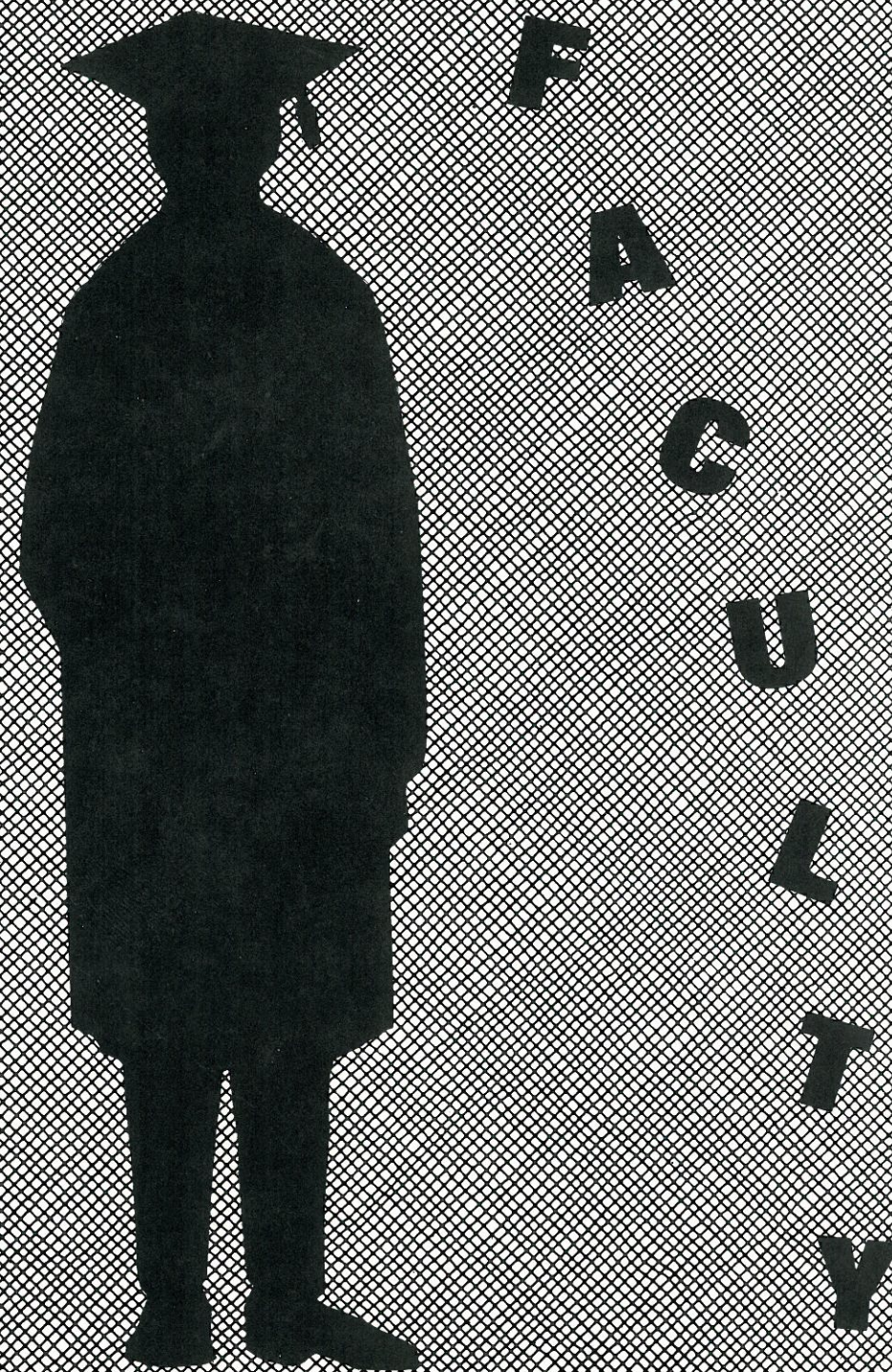
Dean's Message:

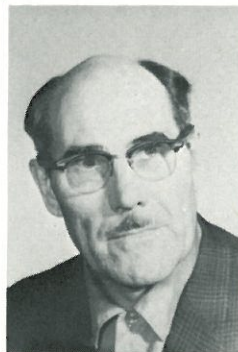

It has been a distinct pleasure to have been associated with all of these exceptionally fine gentlemen, and the members of their staffs.

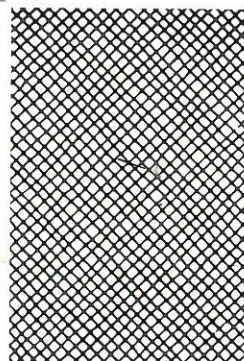

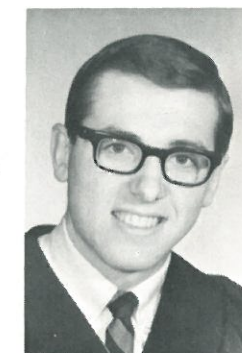
CRAWFORD, Leslie Ann

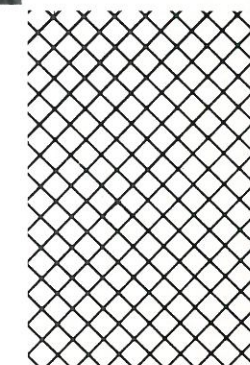
CUNNINGHAM, Philip

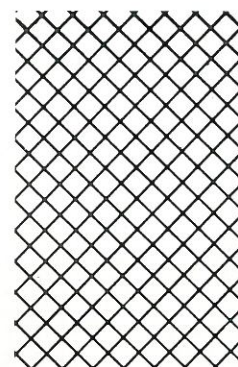
GOIN, Linda

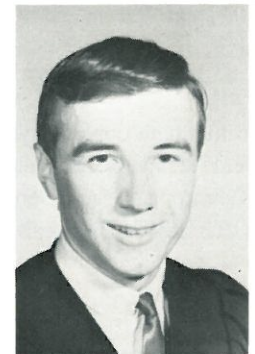
HILLS, Rick

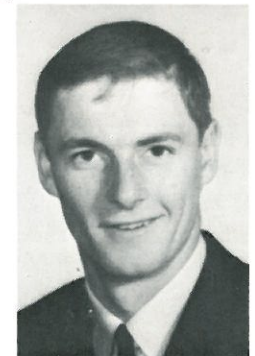
IRVING, Louise


JONES, Bruce

Bruce was active on the basketball squad and in most sports until he became a Christmas graduate. Best luck in your new career, Bruce.



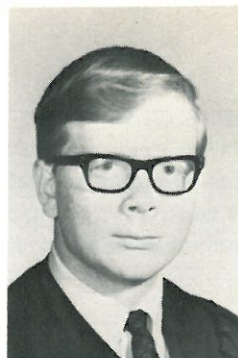
KEARNS, Donna

Carol is one of our shy students who didn't get her picture taken and who also wouldn't disclose her past. We do know that she is from Red Deer, though.



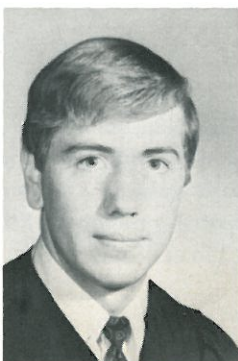
MINKE, Elain

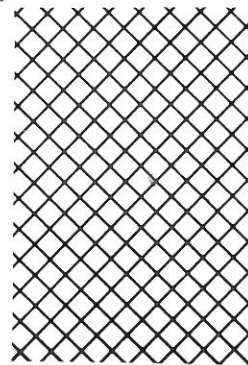

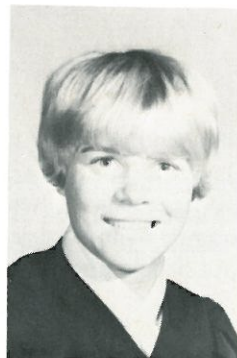

Brian is from Red Deer and the Legacy Staff joins the rest of the students in wishing Brian the best of luck in the future.



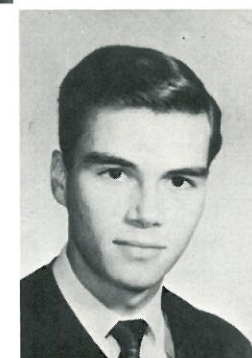
SIMONSON, Parnell

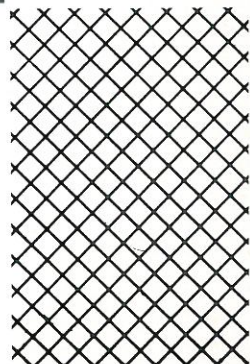
SIROIS, Kevin

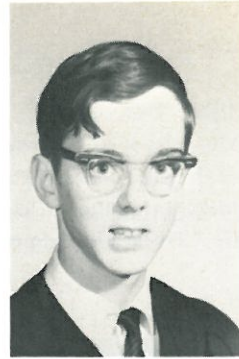

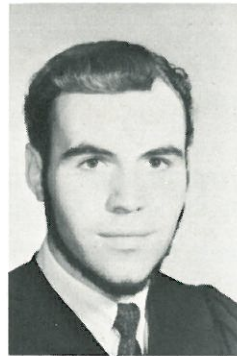
STAFFORD, Denis

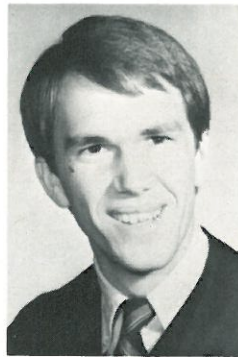
STECKLY, Stephen

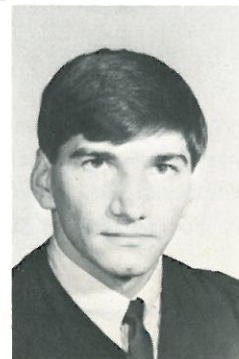
STIRLING, Nancy

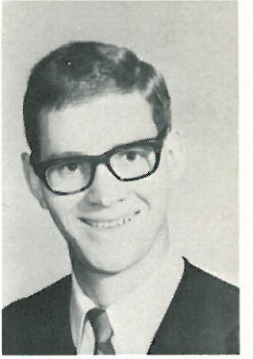
STOEHR, Ernest

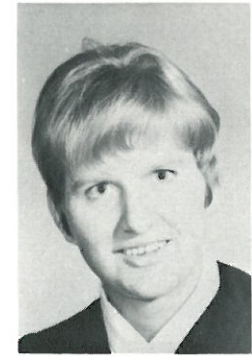
THORDARSON, Ellen

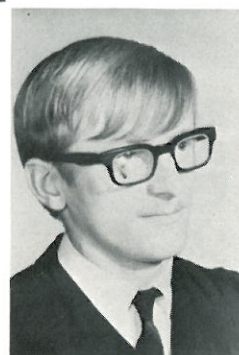




WHITE, Doug

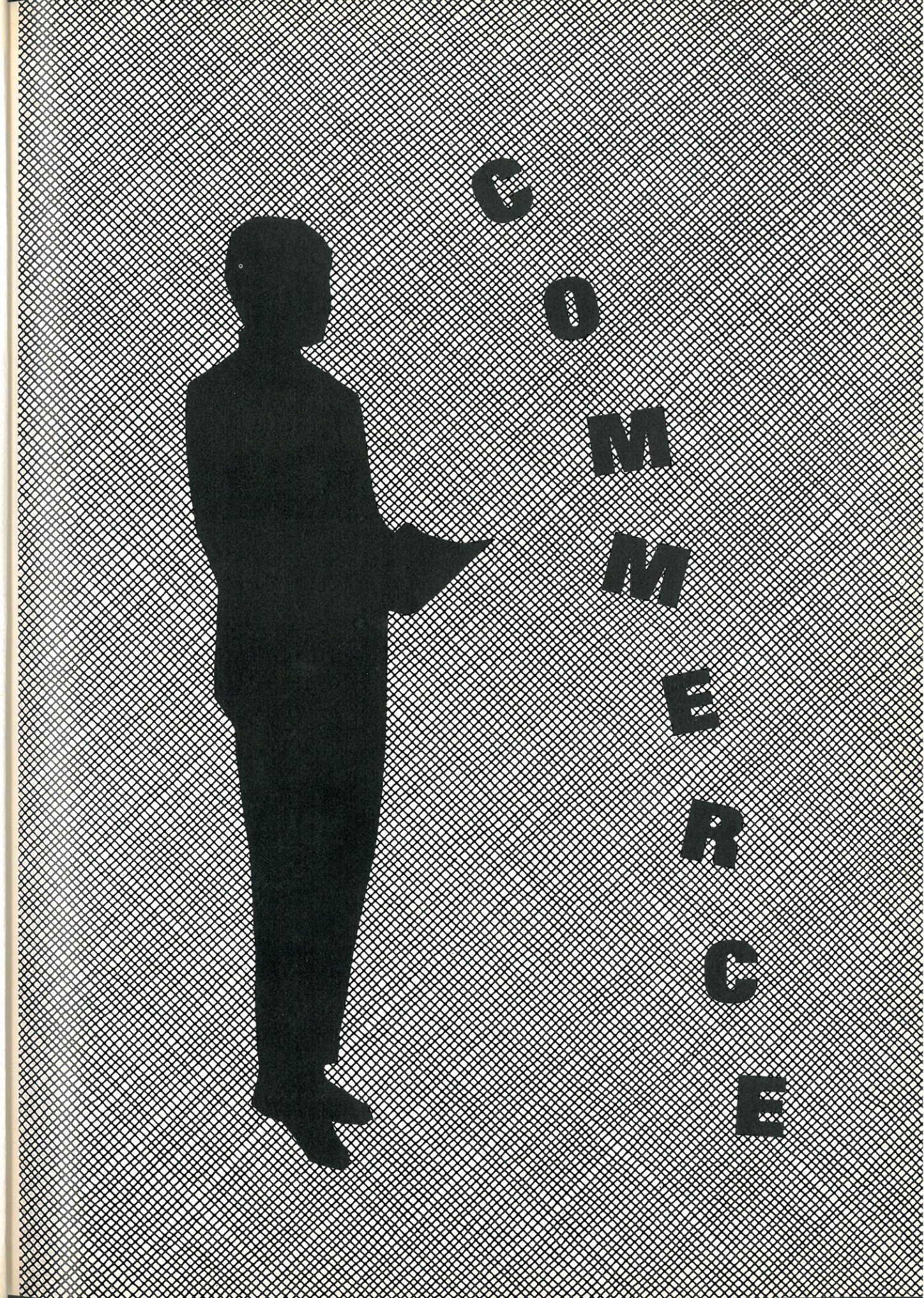

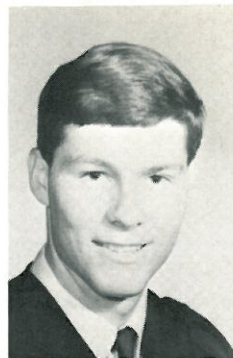

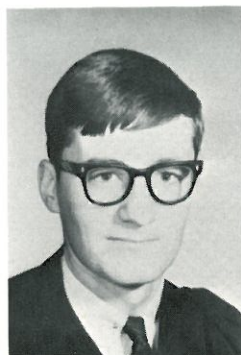
CANN, Donald

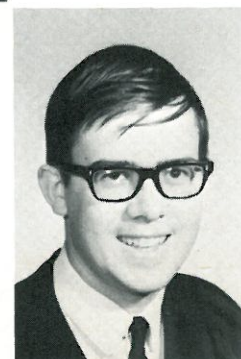
FRASER, Calvin

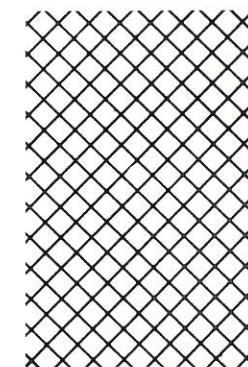


JOPKO, Corrine

Faye comes to this college from Penhold. She is majoring in History and plans to take up a worthwhile profession--teaching of course!



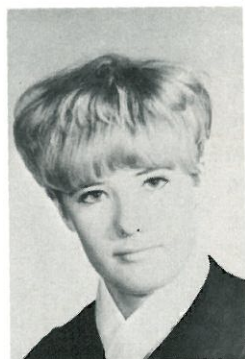

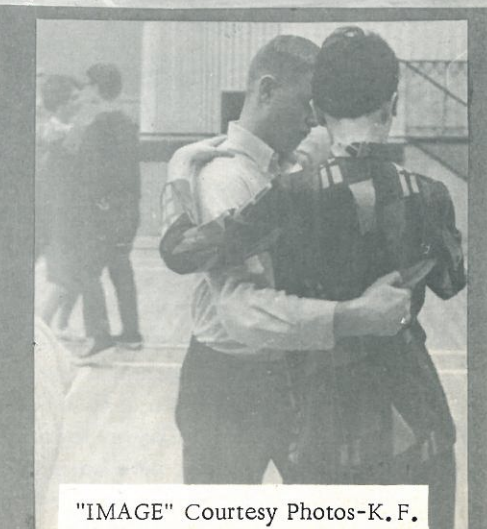
The Inquiry Club
