Mrs. W. B. Parsons

Mrs. W.B. Parsons was elected to the Board of Trustees of the Red Deer Public School District in October, 1955, and became Chairman of the Board in 1959. She has served in that capacity from that time to the present.

Mrs. Parsons played an important role in organizing the Red Deer Junior College, and it was largely through her efforts that it has become a realization. She acted as Chairman of the Provisional Board when it was formed in July, 1963 and continued in that postion until becoming Chairman of the incorporated Red Deer Junior College Board in December, 1963. Shortly after her election to the Red Deer City Council this past year, Mrs. Parsons retired from this office.

In 1967, Mrs. Parsons was appointed to the Senate of the University of Alberta, where she had earned a B. A. (Hon. Eng.) and her teaching certificate. Mrs. Parsons is a member of the Junior High School Curriculum Committee, has served actively as an Executive member of the Alberta School Trustees Association and as Chairman of the Urban Section of that organization. In addition, she has served as program Convenor and Chairman of the Scholarship Committee for the Red Deer Home and School Association, is a member of the Ladies' Auxiliary to the Richard Parsons Auxiliary Hospital, and is a member of the Women's University Club.

In the words of the citation naming Mrs. Parsons as the Alberta Teachers' Association's selection as the "First Lady in Education for 1966", ' A community is fortunate indeed when it finds in its midst a woman of outstanding ability who will strive so selflessly to provide, for all who would use them, the best of educational opportunities and who can organize her own talents and those of others towards greater public service."

In the formation of any institution someone has to take the initial action. In the case of the Red Deer Junior College, the Red Deer School District was this initiating unit, with Superintendant Dawe in the forefront.

When classes were begun in 1964 an agreement was made with the Red Deer School District that granted it the administrative duties of the college until such time as the college moved from its temporary quarters in the L. T. C. H. S. to its own campus. Mr. Dawe was the chief executive for this infant college. Those who have been associated with Mr. Dawe over the short existence of Red Deer Junior College find it difficult to adequately express their appreciation of this man's work. With the relocation of the campus, Mr. Dawe is still Executive Officer of the College Board and acts as a liaison between the College Committee and the Department of Education. He is a past president of the Rotary Club and has served on innumerable civil committees connected with education, such as, the Safety Council, the Planning Commission, the Recreation Commission and

the Education Council of the Chamber of Commerce.

In his attempt to expand the role of education in Red Deer and her neighboring counties, Mr. Dawe has freely given much more than one would expect of a single individual.
