

Message from the Vice-President

Legacy 1970 is published at the conclusion of a particularly eventful year for the Red Deer College. During this year, legislation creating a provincial college system, and in a number of ways affecting the Red Deer College, was proclaimed. As a result of this legislation, "Junior" was dropped from the name of our College; a new Board of Governors, including a representative of the Students' Association, was appointed; and negotiations to form a joint student-faculty policy recommending body were initiated. The legislation gave the Students' Association corporate status with power to own property and govern student affairs.

The tireless efforts of a number of groups, including students, to obtain approval for the College to offer second year university courses finally resulted in approval from the Minister of Education early in this session. Discussions with the Universities Coordinating Council and various committees, councils and departments of the University of Alberta aimed at finalizing arrangements for second year continued throughout the year.

This session, we have witnessed substantial growth in the institution in enrolment, curriculum, physical plant, extracurricular activities involving students and faculty and institutional identity and prestige.

There is little doubt that with the support of faculty and students the College will continue to grow and prosper.

The 1969-70 student body has certainly been most cooperative in tolerating somewhat distressing conditions caused by construction and in actively promoting the College. I am certain I speak for the Board as well as myself in expressing appreciation and wishing you success and happiness in your future endeavours.



Darlene came to us from the south. Her major interest which we're aware of is music and we understand that she is very good at it. Keep up the good work Darlene.




Marlene Brouwer

Phyllis is a resident of Red Deer as well. She didn't name any hobbies but we wish her luck all through life.




Susan Oppelt

It would certainly be nice if the Arts students would tell us a little more about themselves, but as it is all we know about Ron is that he comes from Ponoka. Good Luck!




