

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

For all of you, I hope that the past year at Red Deer College has been a truly enjoyable one—both academically and socially. Certainly, I found my relationship with the student body to be a particularly enjoyable one. It was additionally pleasing to experience the quality and level of communication between your representatives and the Faculty, the Board of Governors, and the Administration. For those of you returning to the College next year, I would encourage you to continue to foster these relationships and to make a point of dropping in on some of the meetings of each of these groups.

There were two important events, which strongly affect the students, that occured during the past year and in which some of you played a significant part.

The first of these was the understanding developed between Colleges and Universities which unequivocally guaranteed that transfer students going from a College, and having a recommendation from that College, would be treated by the University to which they were transferring just as if they were students already in attendance at that University. Gone then are the sometimes heard concerns of "If I go to a College, can I readily move to any University in Alberta at the end of my first or second year?" The criteria by which Diploma students may also transfer to many University programs were also established.

The second event of import to the student body was the initiation of discussions within the College to establish a form of Goverance in which students, as well as faculty and administration, would have an equal voice in establishing the College's longer term policies and plans. I expect that it will take several years of experimenting to develop the best form of Goverance and would thus strongly urge that you make known your comments on this matter to either the Students' Association or to myself.

No message at this time would be really complete if it did not convey the very best wishes from the College for your continuing career. Hopefully, it will involve a return to this College or some other educational institution; if not now, then on those occasions when a few more specific skills or a little more understanding will add significantly to your progress and your enjoyment of life.

Many of us, though, will be returning; returning to a good institution; but one which could be better. Student involvement in college goverance reached a new high in 1974, due largely to people whose names alone would fill up this page. Still, there are not enough. Student government is in itself a learning experience which is not only free, but, I am happy to say, one of the most rewarding experiences of my life.

As members of a generation credited with being the most physically fit, well informed, socially conscious generation this country has ever known, we must be sure our individual impact is felt in Canada. We must take our stand in the face of increasing technocracy and bureaucracy and make sure we receive what we deserve. We should in other words, see fulfillment qualitatively rather than quantitatively.

Among the things that have impressed me is student participation in charitable causes, (United Appeal, Red Cross, and so on). Interest shown on the part of many people in student affairs was reassuring and has convinced me that we really are tomorrow's voice today.

As we take our place in the larger community, you will undoubtably adapt your ideas to the environment to some extent. But, beware, do not change so completely that you conform to the status quo and abandon the ideals we cherish as mere youthful dreams. They can, in fact, become reality and it is our duty to be sure that they happen. I believe that the social and academic experiences have helped prepare students to cope with our world and I am sure that some of you (I hope all) will be instrumental in the development of Alberta; a province deserving of the potential of its people.

In conclusion, I would like to congratulate the students responsible for the production of this yearbook. I am sure it will provide many happy hours for students to reflect on their many experiences at Red Deer College. Good luck, everyone.
