

ECHOES


Echoes are the waves of time,



























































































































































Clubs & Societies




KELLY GOHEEN Coach

Terry Burns has an exceptionally strong golf background, having coached for 17 years, played for 39 and also has been an assistant professional.






LAUREL GOODACRE Coach





Between the 9th and 13th of January, 1986, the Red Deer College Kings proved to Eastern Canadian college teams exactly what they have shown the Western teams for the previous three months. They showed them that they are a very definite contender for a national championship.

During these dates, the Kings travelled to Quebec City for the prestigious Limilou Invitational Volleyball Tournament. As the Kings were undefeated with a 15 - 0 winloss record against Alberta competitors, the team was eager to show off it's strengths against some of the Eastern teams

The Kings started off strong defeating the Loyalists of Ontario in straight games with scores of 15 - 9, 15 - 9. The Kings second match was equally as successful as they rolled over John Abbott College of Quebec by scores of 15 - 11, 15 - 6. In the third match of the round robin, the Kings struggled but finally overcame a weaker team from Sherbrooke College in Quebec

with scores of 12 - 15, 15 - 12, 15 - 11.

Because the Kings stayed in first place through the round robin, they were to play the second place team from the other pool, in their semifinal. In this game the Kings were faced with the top Ontario team, Centennial College.

The Kings stormed out to an early lead and won the first game of the best of three semi-final easily - 15 - 3. Centennial fought back in the second game, but the Kings finally prevailed 16 - 14.

In the other semi-final, the defending national champions Limilou Titans easily beat the hapless Sherbrooke team.

This set the stage for the big showdown between Quebec's best and Alberta's best men's volleyball teams. Both of Quebec City's major newspapers ran large articles calling this match a prelude to the national final with the two top ranked teams in the nation competing.

The first game of this best of five final showed intense competition with the two teams tied midway through the match. In the latter stages, the Limilou team pulled away winning 15 - 9. The inspired Quebec team then ran away with the second game winning with a score of 15 - 4. In the third game the Quebec team made many changes with their players, utilizing their bench. Disgusted with their previous play and the insult of the Quebec bench being put in, the Kings ripped into the Titans winning 15 - 0. In the fourth game, however, the Limilou Titans rallied back with their consistant style of play to defeat the Kings 15 - 11 and win the match 3 games to 1.

Upon completion of the match, Coach Gord Inglis was mobbed by french reporters demanding to know if the remaining two months in the season was enough to repair some of the Kings inconsistancies. The ever optimistic Inglis felt confident that the Kings did have what it takes to beat the Titans in the future. Inglis also stated, however, if the Kings were to win the Alberta Championship and then go after the National Championship, many of the smaller aspects of the game must be perfected.

If these things are done, hopefully 1986 will provide Red Deer College with a strong finish in the National Championship.

TOURNAMENTS HOCKEY




The Kings, as pre-tournament favorites, walked over the Douglas College Royals Friday night with the score 6 - 0.



Assisting Luterbach are Nancy McInerney and Jake Pohl.




This trip to Montreal was definitely worthwhile for the development of team and individual skills. As well, the exposure to the French Candian culture will always be remembered.






























RDC QUEENS VISIT JAPAN -

MAJOR OBSERVATIONS:


- 1. Singing in bars (I even croaked out a couple).

Generally, extremely crowded, oodles of traffic, no accidents, no crime, housing very expensive, 6 million people commute daily into Tokyo for work, clean, mobile car washes, hydraulic lift car parks, men well dressed, women shy but very pretty, service stations with pumps overhead, many chaffeurs, everything closed at New Year's (5-6 days), everyone visits Shrines for New Year's blessing, etc., etc.



















BASKETBALL KINGS TO VANCOUVER!


The Red Deer College Basketball Kings left for Vancouver on Wednesday, January 8 and returned on Monday, January 13.
