


John Alexander Evans May 2, 1940 - September 14, 1990

Always look for and never lose sight of the child within.





This fest even included an air band contest which featured the great " Shave off contest. There were water balloon races, and the grand







Since many of us have now had a chance to familiarize ourselves with R.D.C.. I thought I'd throw in a little dictionary of terms. Some of these words and places might not have crossed your pallet.

Far Side (n) - great place to slip away from reality. RDC'S *spirit* emporium. Generally packed at noon and at three. Good food, good music, great drinks.


Forum (n) - the central meeting place of RDC. Not a good place to try to study. Often smells like pizza in the afternoon (hmm, I wonder why?).

Infidelity (n) - More fun than skiing.


