





RDC experienced a night of rockin' reggae with One. This band brought a special brand of music to the students that very few have heard. If you missed them this year make sure to catch them next year.





Students train in a fleet of eight single engine aircrafts, one twin and two flight simulators.

















### Bachelor of Physical Ed.




### Bachelor of Science


### Biotech, Chemtech and




### Rarly Childhood Dev.

# DEREK MELCHERT

As President of the Music Society, Derek Melchert is responsible for listening and dealing with music society students' concerns. In October, Derek was making decisions over the phone from Saskatoon. Why? Because he was diagnosed with Gillian Barre Syndrome, a virus that attacks the nervous system.

"It was scary when I did not know what I had. I went to three doctors in Red Deer who would not diagnose me. Finally, I went back home to Prince Albert, and my family doctor sent me to the University of Saskatoon Hospital, where I underwent a series of tests to confirm my condition."

The Gillian Barre Syndrome is rare, affecting one in a hundred thousand people. Derek had paralysis, where all of his senses were numbed. His sense of smell and taste were dulled and his speech was severly affected. His friends and family were shocked because he was so active in the music department, having lead vocals in the Noon Shows and Music Pubs.

On November 29th, Derek returned to RDC to perform with the band *Cat's Meow* in the music pub. He sang with great enthusiasm and received much support from the entire audience. "I never lost hope, when I realized how many people believed in me. It is most important to keep the communication lines open with your family when you have a problem. Especially when you are in college, you must keep on trying when times get tough."





### The 1991-92 Red Deer College Kings enjoyed a very successful season.




















#### The Red Deer College Volleyball Queens began their 1991-1992 season with a lengthy road trip to Bozeman, Montana from the






## S KIING CROSS-COUNTRY

\* The Red Deer College K.I.T.E. Wall of Excellence was officially unveiled as a constant reminder of the contributions and commitments students make within the College or within the community.


