Nursing - History

In January 1965 the Red Deer General Hospital Board established a Committee on Education to investigate the possibility of estabilishing a nursing program in Red Deer. A feasibility study was done and the recommendations resulted in approval being granted to establish a nursing program at Red Deer College. The first students were admitted in September, 1968.

The stated purposes of the program were to prepare graduates to give patient centred nursing care in the beginning staff positions at institutionsprovidingacuteand long term care, and to qualify the graduates for registration in the Province of Alberta.

The initial program was 74 weeks of study which included nursing courses as well as support courses from physical, social and biological sciences and the humanities. In 1974 the faculty initiated an increase in program length to 78 weeks in order to strengthen the clinical component, and this was lengthened again in 1982 to 88 weeks.

When the program began the quota was for 36 students. This increased to 72 in 1976 and to 80 in 1983. Faculty members also increased from 7 to 20 full time positions in 1988.

Currently there are four different components to the Nursing Department: 2 year Nursing Diploma, 4-year RDC/University of Alberta Collaborative Degree program, Bachelor of Science in Nursing and Post-Basic Nursing.

In the Winter of 1994, the Nursing Department will graduate the first class of the 4-year RDC/University of Alberta Collaborative Nursing students.

FUTURE OUTLOOK

• Future managers may keep "electronic dossiers" of their employees' electronic-mail and fax messages, raising legal and political issues. Job applicants or candidates for high office could be confronted with messages they sent or received decades earlier.

· Synthetic spider silk may substitute for steel in suspension bridges. Spider silk is strong, flexible, and resilient. A man-made version of the silk could also find its way into bulletproof vests, spacecraft, and military vehicles.

• Genome mapping could one day enable scientists to engineer evolution. People could be altered to be superintelligent or have indefinite lifespans.

 Tomorrow's leaders may be sent to special leadership schools where they can learn how to deal with increasingly complex world issues. "Schools for rulers" might include the study of historical and contemporary political upheavals, systems theory, and chaos theory.

• Nuclear waste to be permanently entombed at an isolation site will carry warning signs designed to last 10,000 years into the future. The warning will have to transcend unforeseeable transformations in societies, cultures, and

languages in order to protect future generations from dangers.

• Global warming may cause the Northern Hemisphere's glaciers to expand rather than shrink. Warmer winter temperatures could lead to more snowfall over high northern latitudes, thus stimulating ice-sheet growth.

 Inexpensive "one-shot" vaccines may someday offer protection against a wide variety of diseases, including polio, malaria, Lyme disease, and AIDS. One-time vaccination at birth may allow children to be inoculated earlier and eliminate the need for booster shots to maintain immunity.

• The greenhouse effect could take a heavy toll on human health, allowing tropical diseases to affect nontropical, populations, raising skin-cancer rates, causing heat-related stress and illness, and worsening air pollution.

Recreation Administration - History

The Recreation Administration program was started in 1975 when lan Reid was hired to develop a two year university transfer program in conjunction with the Physical Education Department. The Fall semester of 1975 actually had no "recreation core" subjects. The first of these subjects were added in the Winter term of 1975/76. Enrollment began with about 5 students and has grown to over 70.

A program tradition, the Fall orientation, was first held in 1977 with the first weekend orientation trip happening in 1978. The first trips were backpacking trips taken to Ram River Falls. In the 80's the orientation was held every Fall at the Goldeye Centre located near Nordegg.

In 1982, a Red Deer student, Cari Vaselenak won the Halladay Award recognizing the provinces top Recreation Administration student. Since that time Red Deer College has won the award 10 times (including 6 consecutive times).

In 1979, the Recreation Student Society initiated the Sylvia Grebiuk Scholarship which was later changed to the lan Reid Scholarship in recognition of his contribution to the program. portions reprinted from RDC 88-89 Yearbook

Early Childhood Development - History

The Early Childhood Development program at Red Deer College began in the Fall of 1975 with 16 full time students in a certificate program. In the Fall of 1981 the program expanded to include a two year diploma course. In 1988 there were 35 diploma students, 60 certificate and approximately 100 part-time students in outreach communities. There was also full time certificate programs in Hobberna and Wetaskiwin. In the summer of 1989 the ECD program will offer the first courses in its new Special Needs Post-Diploma program.

Students in the program take a variety of courses to provide them with the opportunity to gain the knowledge and skills needed to work with young children and their families. The department operates their own lab, Play Matters, where students have the opportunity to observe and work in a model childcare setting which implements the beliefs and values of the program. Teachers' Assistant - History The Teachers' Assistant Program (which used to be named Teachers' Aide Certificate Program) began at Red Deer College in September of 1975. Originally designed to train people to assist teachers with noninstructional tasks, the curriculum had a fairly heavy emphasis on clerical skills and office procedures. The enrollment in the early years of the program fluctuated from 8 to 15 students.

By 1981 the enrollment had increased to 25 students, a full time coordinator and one other full time faculty member. The funding for the program was incorporated into the College's base budget with approval from the Department of Advanced Education. With this growth it was possible to expand the course offerings and to begin offering more courses emphasizing ways to assist the teacher with instructional tasks. In addition, special education courses were introduced as the demand for aides to work in this area increased.

In 1988 the program had a quota of 30 students but was receiving approximately 90 applications each year. reprinted from RDC 38-89 Yearbook

MAJOR EVENTS IN MISTORY

1963

Red Deer Junior College firstbeganinawingatLindsay Thurber Comprehensive High School

The issue of Canadian nuclear armament, which brought down the Diefenbaker government, was resolved as Prime Minister Pearson reached an agreement to accept US nuclear warheads for Canadian missiles. The Final pact was signed with the stipulation that the nuclear warheads would remain under US control on Canadian soil. but could not be used without Canadian authorization.

US President John F. Kennedy who emphasized vouthful idealism was assassinated November 22.

Singers like Bob Dylan and Joan Baez led a revival of folk music.

Four young Englishmen - John Lennon, Paul McCartney, George Harrison, Ringo Starr - named the Beatles for their insistant 4-4 beat, scored a tremendoushitinaconcertat the London Palladium. This phenomena became known as 'Beatlemania".



188 MAJOR EVENTS IN HISTORY

1964

This was the year the last "Babyboomers" were to be born.

BettyFriedanpublished The Feminine Mystique, a book that helped trigger off what is now know as the "women's liberation movement".

This year signified the end of the "Baby-Boom Generation," and the beginning of a new generation at Red Deer College with our first President, Peter Raffa.

1965

Pope Paul VI declared that the Jewish people were not responsible for the death of Christ and have been persecuted unjustly for 2000 years.

The first 'teach-ins' were held at universities in the US and Britian to protest events in Vietnam and Southern Rhodesia, and violations of civil rights.

Northeastern US and southeastern Canada were plunged into darkness for severalhoursbyapowerfailure (an increase in the birth rate was reported nine months later).

1967

Canada celebrated its one hundredth birthday. Bonnie and Clyde (Warner Brothers) won the Oscar for Best Production.

1.968

The boundary between fine and popular arts was blurred by Pop Art (Warhol) and rock musicals (Hair).

Justice Minister Pierre Elliott Trudeau, a French-Canadian who opposed the Quebec separatist movement, succeeded Lester Pearson as prime minister. A victory in House of Commons elections gave Trudeau's Liberal Party Canada's first majority government since 1962.

1969

Informality and exaggeration prevailed in fashion (beards, miniskirts). A nonpolitical "counterculture" developed and traditional bourgeois life goals were rejected. Use of marijuana and hallucinogens spread (Woodstock festival).

Indian influence was felt in music (Beatles), religion (Ram Dass), and fashion.

Achievements in space were noted as men landed on the moon.

Red Deer College added the first career programs: Nursing, Business Administration, Social Services, Secretarial Sciences and College Preparatory.

Opposition to US involvment in Vietnam, especially among university students turned violent.



1970

Second year transfer courses were introduced at Red Deer College.

1971

Bonaza ended in 1971 and Lorne Greene made his final appearance as "Ben Cartwright".

The critics picked Eric Rohmer's movie Clair's Knee as the best film of the year. The Door's lead singer

Jim Morrison died at his Paris retreat.

1972

Hard times hit Red Deer College with below anticipated enrollment which resulted in the Byrne Inquiry; this resulted in sweeping changes in the Board of Administration.

1973

Marijuana was used to treat glaucoma; a vaccine to prevent rabies was developed. The US passed the Endangered Species Act. prohibiting the Federal Government from supporting projectsthatmightjeopardize

designated animals. A bone tool found in the Yukon is dated to about 27,000 BC, one of the earliest dates for human beings in the New World.

Woody Allen's Sleeper, Last Tanao in Paris, and Day for Night hit the scene.

In Chicago, the Sears Tower was completed at 1454 feet, making it the tallest building in the world.

1974

The Canadian National Tower in Toronto reached a result of the Three Mile Island height of 1805 feet but it was regarded as a freestanding structure, not a true building. Pauline Jewett was the

first woman to become president of a University when she was hired at Simon Fraser University.

Rehabilitation Program was established at Red Deer College.

1975

Red Deer College introduces three new programs, Teacher's Aide Certificate, Early Childhood Development, and Legal Assistant.

This year marks the last of those born in the "Twentysomething" generation, and the beginning of disco music.

1976

Those born from this year forward will be identified as members of "Generation X". The Summer Olympic Games in Montreal, they were the first ever held in Canada.

1977

The Equal Rights Amendment for women languished and the civil rights for homosexuals were opposed.

1.978

The Red Deer , ollege School of Music commenced operations with the given mandate of meeting the educational needs of the musical community in Central Alberta.

1979

Protests sparked as a reactor accident.

A serious gasoline shortage drives prices to new heights.

1980

Pierre Trudeau was reelected as Prime Minister of Canada as he ousted Progressive Conservative leader Joe Clark.

1981

Lady Di & Prince Charles were married.

Red Deer College introduces the Apprenticeship and Technology programs.

1982

The Computer Systems Technology program was installed at Red Deer College. The famous Canadian play "Billy Bishop Goes To War" was broadcasted on CBC-TV's on September 12th.

1.984

Peirre Trudeau stepped down as leader of the Liberal party after 15 as Canada's Prime Minister and one year as the leader of the opposition.

1985

Carried the memory of the "Live Aid" marathon rock concern for Africa.

Dr. Ed Luterbach became the "Acting" President of Red Deer College.

1986

The Red Deer College hired Dr. Ed Luterbach to become the full-time president.

1987

Margaret Thatcher became the first British prime minister in this century to win 3 consecutive terms.

1.988

The labor union founded in 1980 by Lech Walesa. outlawed in 1982, was legalized.

1989

Mikhail Gorbachev was widely considered to be the man responsible for ending of the Cold War.

100.000 students and workers marched on Tiananmen Square, Beijing in support of more forceful changes in their country.

The Berlin wall was opened after being sealed since 1961.

1993

Kim Campbell became the first female Prime Minister of Canada in June of this year.

The Canadian people elected themselves a new government, the first Liberal aovernment since 1984. Jean Chretien and his Liberal party formed a majority goverment on November 4.
